

READING FISHING CLUB - BEALE PARK FISHERY

LOCATION

The entrance to the fishery is off the A329 approx. 1 mile NW of the centre of Pangbourne.

Postcode: RG8 9NW

The river is split into 2 separate sections. Section A is from the top field down to the top of the islands. Section B is from the islands down to, and including, the bottom road side carpark.

LOCAL RULES

On club match dates access to the lake area is closed from sundown on the previous day until one hour after the match ends, except for those fishing the club match. Access to Beale Park river is not affected.

1. Access opens at 7.30am. No entry into the park before this time.
2. Fishing must cease at ½ hour before sunset and premises must be vacated by sunset if parked in the main carpark. Fishing on the river is permitted up to 1 hour after sunset if your vehicle is parked at Church Lane or Sots Hole carparks only
3. No night fishing.
4. When using the main Beale Park car park, cars are to be parked in the area designated on the map (unless full), Club car park permit card MUST be displayed.
5. No fishing from designated areas as shown on the map or in the designated mooring area of the river.
6. No radio controlled bait boats or similar.
7. Members only. Members must carry Club permit and valid E.A. licence.
8. A 4 metre long keepnet is recommended if retaining fish at this venue.
9. The use of live fish as bait is prohibited

NB. THIS VENUE IS HELD FOR A ONE YEAR PERIOD. IT IS VITAL THAT ALL MEMBERS ADHERE STRICTLY TO THE ABOVE.

TO ALL MEMBERS PLEASE BE AWARE THAT WE HAVE NO ACCESS TO BEALE PARK TO USE THE TOILET FACILITIES.

SEASON

River Thames: 16th June to March 14th inclusive.

Lake: 1st of October to 31st of March inclusive.

CLUB RULES

In addition to the above, the following 'Tappern's and Osier Lake Rules' (see Permit) will apply on this venue:

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7 (first sentence), 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20.

Tappern's and Osier Lake Pike Fishing Rules also apply.
